

Returning to Pre-Covid for Mass!

Communion on the tongue will be distributed by Extraordinary Ministers of Communion (EMC's) as well as Fr. Peter starting immediately.

Hosts will once again be placed in the bowl not the ciborium for the gift procession. This will resume with the new Liturgical Year on November 28th.

With the new Liturgical Year and plans for the collection to be taken up by passing baskets, all ministries will return to pre-pandemic time except for the option to receive from the cup. There is no word on when this option will return.

Helping Families from the Chapman Area!

The parish, working through the Chapman School District, will adopt two to three families in need for Christmas. How can you help?

- Take a slip (or as many as you want/can afford) from the Christmas Tree that will be set up in the gathering space—hopefully by next Sunday. Each slip has one item that comes from a list the family provided the school. It may be clothing, shoes, toys, games, household items, etc. The items vary in cost so hopefully you can find something that works for your budget. If possible, get a **gift receipt** and put it inside the present.
- If shopping isn't your thing, donate money to the parish. This will help buy gifts or be donated to the families to help with groceries, utilities, or other expenses.
- When buying clothing, select items that will help the child fit in and not stand out as different. For other items, choose something that would make this gift special.
- The items need to be wrapped and the slip of paper attached to it. Marita marks off the items and then puts a gift tag on each present with the child's name. She will wrap the gifts if you want her to. Gifts need to be brought to the church or parish office by **Wed, Dec. 15th**.
