

Why Do Catholics Call Mary Our Mother?



Mary's role in history is to bring people to her Son. "The Virgin Mary...is clearly the mother of the members of Christ" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church #963*).

When Jesus hung on the cross Mary and St. John were there (John 19:26-27). Jesus told her, "Woman, behold your son," and to John, "Behold your mother." At that moment

Mary became the mother of us all. Because of her special relationship to Jesus, she is the perfect intercessor for us.

Mass Intentions: A Mass Offering (sometimes known as a "Stipend") is a freewill offering that expresses a desire that the church remember a particular need or thanksgiving or intention in the course of praying at a Mass.

You may ask to have a Mass offered to thank God for blessings received, for answered prayer, for an anniversary or birthday, or for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Your Mass intention can be kept private just by stating "special intention(s)".

The usual freewill offering in our diocese is \$10. You can visit with Marita about Mass Intentions if you have any questions.

VBS a "Roaring" Success!

This year St. Michael's Parish was in charge of organizing the Chapman Community Vacation Bible School with Sara Cook as the leader. This week St. Michael's Parish hosted the VBS for the first time in over 20 years. The theme was "Roar—Life is Wild—God is Good!"

The other two churches who are sponsors are Chapman NAZ and Chapman United Methodist.

Our facilities worked so well for the various activities that the parish will be the site for VBS for the foreseeable future but with all three churches still taking their turn organizing it.

There were 93 total youth from age 3 years old to next school year's 5th grade who attended at least one day. There were 31 adult leaders and helpers and 16 youth helpers. Stewardship Sightings has the individual names of all those who helped.

Day of Recollection—a retreat for couples struggling with infertility—will be held on Saturday, July 27, 2019 from 9:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m. at St. Mary Queen of Angels Parish, Russell, KS. The retreat will include Mass, brunch, an opportunity for confession, as well as inspiring talks from a priest, a witness couple and more.
