Mission Co-op Appeal from COAR! COAR Peace Mission is located in Zaragoza, El Salvador. It is now known as the "Children's Village" with 800 day students, 100 in foster care, a medical and dental clinic, pharmacy, and trade shops. El Salvador is an impoverished country as are COAR's students. To protect the vulnerable requires food, shelter and housemothers. Education requires computers and classrooms and teachers need a fair wage. **FYI:** The loose plate collection today will go towards this cause.

Emergency Drill TODAY!

This is the first of two to help the Disaster/Emergency Team with planning. Reminders:

1. This drill is for an emergency like a fire, tornado, etc. and not active shooter. The emergency will be in the sanctuary/sacristy area so the exit will be out the main entrance doors. (FYI: St. Joseph Church, Andale, had a fire caused by lightning a few weeks ago.)
2. The directions for exiting will seem counterintuitive. Those closest to the exit being used will exit last; those closest to danger exit first. Fr. John, servers and musicians will be first to exit followed by those in first pew and proceeding to the last pew.
3. Everyone needs to participate. This is the only way to determine what works, what doesn't and come up with a plan. Since there has never been a drill before, for this time those with mobility issues will not participate. They will participate once we have a plan in place. The benefits of their participation are outweighed by possible harm.
4. It is essential that everyone respond as if this was a real emergency. This means departing in an orderly fashion—no visiting, no letting someone go in front of you. Leave baby carriers, diaper bags, purses, etc. in pew. At no time will the church not be secured.
5. The gathering place after the drill/evacuation is the parish center. Coffee, juice and rolls will be served.
6. Your input is also important. There will be papers on the tables in the parish center for you to write what worked, what didn't and helpful suggestions.
