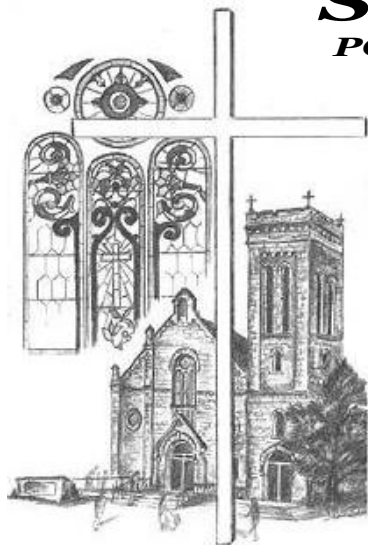

Next Sunday, Fr. Ernest Amoako-Opare will be here to make an appeal for his Diocese. Fr. Ernest is from Ghana and is assigned to Hill City, WaKeeney, Collyer and Damar parishes in the Salina Diocese.

The following is information about the Diocese and where the support will be used.

The Catholic Diocese of Koforidua is found in Ghana west Africa. It was created on July 6, 1992, carved from the Archdiocese of Accra. The Diocese is about thirty (30) years old. It has more rural parishes and stations with schools and clinics. Most of these places are in need of portable drinking water (boreholes). The Diocese is blessed with a lot of young men in the seminary being formed to become priests.

The Catholic Diocese of Koforidua will be pleased to have your assistance in the form of prayer, money and any support to be able to provide these stations with good drinking water and to form the young men for the church.

### **What Was Accomplished Last Sunday?**

Last Sunday was the annual workday at the parish. A lot was accomplished in two hours or so. A **HUGE THANK YOU** to all who helped from 4 years to over 80 years old. There are still a few projects to complete but here are some of the accomplishments:

- ❖ All chairs and tables in the parish center (including the classrooms) and in the two modulars were scrubbed. This is over 200 chairs and over 35 tables. All chairs and tables in the big room were put on the storage racks except for what was needed for the blood drive.
- ❖ The tops of the refrigerator and cabinets in the kitchen were cleaned as well as the refrigerator coils and fan blades.
- ❖ The gutters on the house and garage were cleaned out and a cable secured.
- ❖ Bushes and trees were trimmed.
- ❖ Almost 32 bags of pothole repair were placed in the needed areas of the parking spaces.
- ❖ Section of sidewalk behind house & church was leveled which included removing a huge tree root.
- ❖ Playground equipment was inspected with minor repairs.
- ❖ Room divider in big room of parish center was repaired.
- ❖ Sink faucets in guest bathroom repaired.
