Did you Know?

Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated on the 2nd Friday and Immaculate Heart 2^{nd} Saturday after Trinity Sunday which is June 27^{th} and 28^{th} this year.

Sacred Heart of Jesus: (June is the month of the Sacred Heart.) In 1673, in France, Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque began to receive visions of Jesus. He told her about his love for humanity. She saw his heart, surrounded by thorns, and engulfed in fire. His love was SO GREAT he asked her to create a feast day to celebrate it. Almost 100 years later, the Vatican made it so! We celebrate the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a solemnity—which is the highest level of celebration a feast can be!

Immaculate Heart: Many times, alongside the Sacred Heart, we see a heart for Mary and Joseph too. Mary's heart is called the Immaculate Heart. It is often seen with a sword piercing through and flowers wrapped around.

Most Chaste Heart: Joseph's heart is called the Most Chaste Heart. It is seen with white lilies, which are a symbol of purity. No official feast day.
