

#### **Eucharistic Miracles Panels**

From October 19-26, some of the over 100 Eucharistic Miracles panels will be displayed in the parish center for viewing. What are **Eucharistic miracles?** Eucharistic miracles consist of unexplainable phenomena occurring after transubstantiation, such as a host visibly transforming into human tissue, a host surviving fire, a host bleeding or the Eucharist alone providing sustenance to a human being for a prolonged period of time. In order to be considered a Eucharistic miracle, the event is investigated by a special task force before deciding it is worthy of belief. Secular sources are often used to investigate and confirm the miracle. Belief in approved miracles is not mandated by the Catholic Church, but can reassure believers of God's presence in our world.
