

Archdiocese for the Military Services: The Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), was supposed to be taken up last weekend but was overlooked by Marita. This collection is taken every three years on the Sunday closest to Veterans Day.

What is AMS? The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese.

The AMS is the Archdiocese for the Military Services, not of the Military Services. This is an important distinction, because the AMS receives no funding from the U.S. Government or U.S. Military and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. Instead, it must rely on the generosity of those whose values and priorities align with its mission, programs and services, to meet its costs.

Road to Sainthood for Fr. Emil Kapaun!

Everything is proceeding as expected. It will take some time for the experts to work through all the material for the miracle needed for his beatification. **Steps to go:** The reported miracle must be examined by three teams that work independently: doctors, theologians and several cardinals. If they and the pope agree that the cure was miraculous, Kapaun can be officially declared blessed. A second miracle, requiring the same process of approval, is needed before he can be declared a saint and a liturgical observance permitted (but not required) worldwide.
