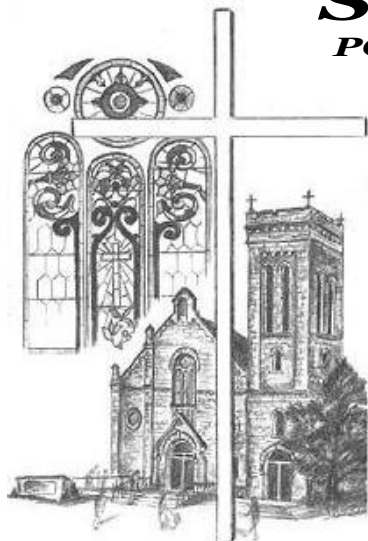

Today's Feast! November 9th

Today we honor a church that counts the world within its parish boundaries. The basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of Rome. That means it is the church of the Roman bishop, who is the pope. And so St. John Lateran is a spiritual home of Catholics everywhere.

The church is called the "Lateran" because it was built on grounds that had once belonged to the Laterani family.

Legend says that the basilica was dedicated on November 9, 324 AD. The baptistry was dedicated to St. John the Baptist, and generations later the whole building was dedicated to John, so it became known as St. John of the Lateran.

The Lateran Basilica reminds us of our history as a people. It is filled with treasured Christian relics. Its high altar is built over a wooden table on which Peter himself is said to have celebrated the Lord's Supper with the Christian community of Rome.

However, on this November feast day, we celebrate not a building but a loving God who provides a home for us on earth and in heaven. According to St. Paul, we are God's building. We are living stones that are built up into God's house.
